



WHAT IS PACE?

PACE (Parents Active in Cooperative Education) is a partnership of Teachers, Children and Parents committed to an enriched learning environment. Together with our school and neighborhoods, PACE strives as a community to enrich and deepen learning, independence, and leadership. Although each PACE program is partly defined by its home school, teachers, and parent resources, all PACE programs meet curriculum requirements for the Northshore School District.

OUR HISTORY

PACE was created in 1973 when fifteen families proposed a program implementing higher parent involvement. Today, PACE is a program offered for grades 1-6 at three sites in the Northshore School District.

ENROLLMENT

Enrollment in PACE is open to all children, grades 1-6, in the Northshore School District on a space-available basis. Each PACE site holds an Information Night during the month of October which gives an overview of the PACE program and outlines the enrollment process. OUR TEACHERS

PACE teachers are dedicated to our children and to our program philosophy. Class curriculum incorporates parent participation to provide a rich, dynamic, and diverse education. Every PACE family commits to 80 volunteer hours of family participation for the school year. This requirement can be fulfilled in a variety of ways, taking into account the diverse talents of parents within the PACE community. By working together for the benefit of our children, parents strengthen the PACE community. Families also support site specific fundraising to keep PACE cost neutral to the school district.
